Co-Signatures

What is it?

The Co-Signatures feature provides the ability to capture an attestation signature in eVisit when required by law or by the health care organization.

Why is it useful?

Advanced Practice Providers (APPs) often work in cooperation with or under a supervising physician. In these types of workflows with APPs, physicians review the work of the APPs then provide a co-signature to attest they have reviewed the chart and approved the care plan.

When should I use it?


Whenever there is a requirement for a supervising physician to attest to an APP's care plan.


Feature Overview


1. In the chart section of the Visit Sidebar, the APP clicks and acknowledges attestation.




2. APP clicks **Request co-sign** checkbox (unless set to always default to request a co-sign, then the APP will not interact with it).




3. Click Sign Notes.






4. The chart will now display the date, timestamp, the signer's first and last name, credentials, and NPI #.



5. To identify visits requiring chart actions, such as co-signing a chart, you can click the Visit History tab and use the Actions Required filter.


6. On the Visit History tab, you will also see icons for visits that require a signature. Clicking this will open the chart tab to sign the notes. Web:




7. Once the chart is signed, the sign icon will disappear and the co-sign icon will appear for the supervising physician.


The Supervising Physician

1. Supervising physicians can click the Visit History tab and filter on Actions Required to view visits requiring their co-signature. Web:





2. On the Visit History tab, supervising physicians will also see an icon for visits that require a co-signature. Clicking this will open the chart tab allowing them to co-sign the notes.






3. Provider will review APP chart notes, then select attestation.






